#### The Road We Walk Together

Our journey would not have been possible without our valued families, dedicated teachers, and the many professionals who helped our school. Together over the years, we have raised awareness throughout the community, partnered with local organizations for unique educational experiences, and received millions of dollars through donations and grants to provide educational materials. All the while, we retain exceptional educators and provide professional development to them and completed many building improvements.



### DIRECTOR

2022-2023 school year was one of growth and continued improvement for Clayton Early Childhood Center. A few success are noted below:

- Our Center provided care to 128 children and their families.
- CECC continued to maintain and meet the guidelines and criteria for NAEYC accreditation.
- 100% of our preschool graduates were kindergarten ready as evidenced by Developmental Checklists and Creative Curriculum Continuum.
- CECC maintained class size and exceeded state requirements for teacher-child ratios.
- Negotiated a 10-year lease with the City of Clayton.
- Our Cardinal and Dragonfly classrooms, as well as the Lower Gross Motor Room, received new flooring.
- Grants for operating expenses were secured through The Childcare Relief Fund.
- Grant through the Tracy Family Foundation made possible the purchase of creative curriculum kits for our classrooms.
- Retention grants provided direct financial assistance to our valued educators.
- Technology and enhancement grants have afforded us the opportunity to upgrade our technology and program essentials.
- 4 exterior, perimeter cameras were installed.
- CECC partnered with The City of Clayton Parks and Recreation to celebrate Arbor Day and memorialized the planting of 6 trees which over time will weave into 1 large tree.
- A tree was planted commemorating 12 employees who have dedicated 10 or more years with CECC.
- Each staff member received CPR, First Aid, safe sleep training and additional professional development opportunities through CECC.
- The Board and administration worked to strengthen infrastructure and continue to be fiscally responsible.

Clayton Early Childhood Center began as a partnership between parents and teachers who imagined a school that would provide a loving, creative, and thoughtful education to children from their very first weeks of life.

This initial group of parents became a committee who began to share their talents and formalize their ideas and soon evolved into the governing Board of CECC.

Momentum built and the future of CECC came into focus: An intimate educational community where families and teachers work together to support the creative learning, health, happiness, social growth, and development of our children.

Today, CECC offers high-quality education and care in a tranquil setting, at competitive tuition rates, with flexible, full-day programs (7:30 am - 6:00 pm) which meet the needs of working parents without additional before and after school care.

We work to build long-term relationships with the families we serve and consider the opportunity to share in their children's growth and development to be an honor and privilege.

Our school is a nonprofit, cooperative effort with a strong commitment to maintaining responsible, transparent, and flexible practices to maintain trust among those we serve and to ensure the organization will grow and evolve with its members.

As a state-licensed and nationally accredited preschool, CECC follows all guidelines outlined by the State of Missouri and the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Our school is inspected by State and local Fire Marshals, State Sanitation Inspectors, and State Child Care Specialists.


#### **ACCREDITED**

#### **HIGH-QUALITY PRESCHOOL**

CECC is nationally accredited through the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and meets the 10 early childhood program standards. Standards are based on the latest research on the education and development of young children. All NAEYC-Accredited programs must:



- Promote positive relationships for all children and adults to encourage each child's sense of individual worth.
- Implement a curriculum that fosters all areas of child development: cognitive, emotional, language, physical, and social.
- Use developmentally, culturally, and linguistically appropriate and effective teaching approaches.
- Provide ongoing assessments of a child's learning and development and communicate the child's progress to the family.
- Promote the nutrition and health of children and protect children and staff from illness and injury.





- Establish relationships with and use resources of the community to support the achievement of program goals.
- Provide a safe and healthy physical environment.
- Implement strong personnel, fiscal, and program management policies so that all children, families, and staff have a high quality experience.



#### **LEARNING FOR LIFE**





### 100% of preschool graduates were kindergarten ready in 2023

By the time children reach kindergarten entry, many are reading sight words and writing simple sentences. Of all five-year-olds, 100% scored above the 98th percentile on Creative Curriculum Assessments and developmental checklists. Cognitive structures crucial to future learning are fully developed and children are well prepared both academically and socially for both private and public kindergartens.

#### **CREATIVE CURRICULUM**

Creative Curriculum is an award-winning, state-approved curriculum for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. It features research-based content and daily resources that are fully aligned with the Missouri State Early Learning Standards.


Using explorations and discovery as a way of learning, the curriculum enables children to develop confidence, creativity, and lifelong critical thinking skills. Children are encouraged to explore the environment and learn from hands-on experiences. Daily lessons are taught in small focused groups of 3-4 children and in whole class groups.

A portion of the academic day is structured with teacher-directed activities and unstructured with child-directed activities. Preschoolers and toddlers provide input as thematic units are created. Creativity, exploration, and discovery are encouraged. Content areas include reading readiness & literacy, dramatic play, science, math, art, physical, and sensory activities.

Infant curriculum includes regular routines and procedures which meet the unique needs and development of each individual child.

#### 4 major focus areas:

Social & emotional skills



Cognitive awareness

Language development









#### All areas address several goals:

- Developing responsibility for self and others
- Strengthening gross and fine motor skills
- Improving reading and writing proficiency
- ✓ Increasing language and problem-solving techniques


Developmental assessments are completed several times a year for children ages six weeks to five years. Results are shared at parent/teacher conferences and assist teachers in preparing classroom activities that encourage development and academic achievement.



#### **IMPROVEMENTS & UPDATES**


